Danielle Malangone is the Director of National Anti-Trafficking Strategies at the Center for Court Innovation where she provides expert assistance to individual jurisdictions across the country to help plan, implement, and strengthen innovative responses to human trafficking. Mrs. Malangone also coordinates and provides training to judges and court stakeholders across the U.S. on the issue of human trafficking. She has co-authored: *Prostitution Diversion Programs; The Intersection of Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, and Human Trafficking; Forging Partnerships Across Court-Support Organizations, and Responding to Sex Trafficking in Your Jurisdiction: A Planning Toolkit.*

Prior to her consulting work, she served as the deputy director of the Midtown Community Court, where she directed the court's clinical and workforce development operations, as well as its research and planning projects. Most notably, she directed the design and implementation of the court's newest responses to prostitution and human trafficking. Mrs. Malangone was an Adjunct Professor at New School University where she developed and instructed a class on domestic sex trafficking. Before joining the Center in 2005, she worked as a clinical supervisor for the Brooklyn TASC program, where her work helped create alternatives to incarceration for offenders with co-occurring substance use and mental illness. Mrs. Malangone is a graduate of Coro Leadership New York XVIII, and received her B.A. from Oswego State University and M.A. in Forensic Psychology from John Jay College of Criminal Justice.
